



Kaptivo User Guide

Kaptivo Setup

- Install Kaptivo mounting plate centrally above board and control pad mounting plate to your preferred side of the board using the supplied screws.
Maximum board size: 6' x 4' (1.8m x 1.2m)
- Slide Kaptivo unit onto mounting plate.
- Connect Kaptivo data cable, and power cable, to sockets inside control panel.
- Simply push fit to attach the control pad to mounting plate. Plug in the power adapter to outlet.
- Connect your computer or mobile device to the KAPTIVO-xxxxxx Wi-Fi set-up network.
- Go to setup.kaptivo.live in your browser, and follow on-screen instructions.

Using Kaptivo

- Go to Kaptivo.live in web browser from any computer or mobile device
- Enter your name and the Kaptivo ID. Click View Board
- Press button on control pad when button flashes blue

Then invite anyone in the world to view your board.

- Just select **INVITE**
- To view any changes to the board, select **HISTORY**
- To download your work as a PDF, select **DOWNLOAD**

To change Wi-Fi network or move to another board:

With power on, press and hold the button on the control pad until indicator light flashes green and red. Reconnect to KAPTIVO-xxxxxx Wi-Fi network. Then visit setup.kaptivo.live from your browser to reconfigure.

Important Safety Information / Consignes de Sécurité Importantes

- Only use the power supply and cabling provided with your Kaptivo. Using alternate power supplies or cables may invalidate your warranty and the Safety Approvals of your Kaptivo.
- Only connect the Kaptivo as per the instructions in this manual. None of the individual parts of the Kaptivo system (power supply, power cord, control pad or main unit) are suitable for connection to any other device.
- Ensure that the power socket outlet is located close to the Kaptivo and is easily user accessible.

Regulation Information

This device complies with Part 15 of the FCC Rules. Operation is subject to the following two conditions:

- This device may not cause harmful interference, and
- This device must accept any interference received, including interference that may cause undesired operation.

Changes or modifications not expressly approved by the party responsible for compliance could void the user's authority to operate the equipment.

This equipment has been tested and found to comply with the limits for a Class B digital device, pursuant to Part 15 of the FCC Rules. These limits are designed to provide reasonable protection against harmful interference in a residential installation. This equipment generates, uses and can radiate radio frequency energy and, if not installed and used in accordance with the instructions, may cause harmful interference to radio communications. However, there is no guarantee that interference will not occur in a particular installation. If this equipment does cause harmful interference to radio or television reception, which can be determined by turning the equipment off and on, the user is encouraged to try to correct the interference by one of the following measures:

- Reorient or relocate the receiving antenna.
- Increase the separation between the equipment and receiver.
- Connect the equipment into an outlet on a circuit different from that to which the receiver is connected.
- Consult the dealer or an experienced radio/TV technician for help.

This equipment should be installed and operated keeping the radiator (located within the Kaptivo Unit) at least 7.9 inches (20cm) or more away from person's body. This device must not be co-located or operated in conjunction with any other antenna or transmitter.

Canada

This Device complies with Industry Canada License-exempt RSS standard(s). Operation is subject to the following two conditions:

- This device may not cause interference, and
- This device must accept any interference, including interference that may cause undesired operation of the device.

Under Industry Canada regulations, this radio transmitter may only operate using an antenna of a type and maximum (or lesser) gain approved for the transmitter by Industry Canada. To reduce potential radio interference to other users, the antenna type and its gain should be so chosen that the equivalent isotropically radiated power (e.i.r.p.) is not more than that necessary for successful communication.

Le présent appareil est conforme aux CNR d'Industrie Canada applicables aux appareils radio exempts de licence. L'exploitation est autorisée aux deux conditions suivantes:

- l'appareil ne doit pas produire de brouillage, et
- l'utilisateur de l'appareil doit accepter tout brouillage radioélectrique subi, même si le brouillage est susceptible d'en compromettre le fonctionnement.

Dans le but de réduire les risques de brouillage radioélectrique à l'intention des autres utilisateurs, il faut choisir le type d'antenne et son gain de sorte que la puissance isotrope rayonnée équivalente (p.i.r.e) ne dépasse pas l'intensité nécessaire à l'établissement d'une communication satisfaisante.
